Re: FY2023 Small Business Contracts Report

Dear President Harmon:

In accordance with 30 ILCS 500/45-90(f) of the Illinois Procurement Code, the Chief Procurement Officer (CPO) is required to submit an annual report by November 1 of each year that includes a summary of contracts awarded to small businesses and an analysis of the level of the overall goal concerning purchases from small businesses.

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) awarded 543 contracts for a total value of \$234,014,976.00 to small businesses, including subcontracts, in FY2023. The average contract amount is \$430,966.81.

For FY2023, the department's total spend was \$2,346,864,495.00 which equates to an overall small business participation of 10.00%.

The department has a dedicated bureau, the Office of Business and Workforce Diversity (OBWD), to assist small and disadvantaged businesses in becoming aware of the department's procurement and workforce opportunities. IDOT provides assistance to small businesses, including Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) firms and individuals interested in doing business with the department, in ways that ensure equity, access, and transparency. IDOT, in accordance with federal guidelines, strives to facilitate and implement programs that can help current and future business partners open the door to doing business with IDOT.

A small business compliance plan was submitted to me, by IDOT, outlining the FY2024 goals of the department. The plan has been reviewed and approved by me with the following suggestions:

- Reevaluate the dollar amount of projects considered for the Small Business Set-Aside
 Program to effectuate more projects are included for small businesses on the lettings.
- The Federal Highway Administration program is working on guidelines for a new program, "Enhancing Highway Workforce Development Opportunities Contracting Initiative." This program will allow, on an experimental basis, projects to use innovative contracting approaches that are not otherwise permitted by law, geographic, economic, or other hiring preferences. This will improve workforce development opportunities in the transportation construction sector. I would recommend the department continue to monitor the progress of the development of this program and utilize it to the fullest extent possible when available.
